*A 5% late fee will be assessed on the outstanding balance after 30 days from sale.

*If payment is not made in 60 days, it may be turned over to a collection agency. In addition, the following year the buyer must place a deposit equal to the previous years' balance. Valid credit/debit cards will be accepted subject to a service fee.

INVOICING PROCEDURE:

Payments are encouraged the night of the sale in the sale office. Buyer invoices will be mailed and are due 10 days after receipt. A 5% late fee will be assessed on the outstanding balance 30 days after sale date and referred to collections after 60 days. Payment can be made by cash, check or Credit/Debit card, subject to a service fee.

BUYER INFORMATION:

Buyers should arrive and pre-register prior to the start of the sale. At the Buyers Table, you will receive your buyer number, a sale program, and ensure the proper address & contact person are listed. Please be sure we have correct contact information.

Any individual may bid and purchase an animal subject to the enclosed "Terms & Conditions". All animals will be immediately consigned to slaughter <u>unless</u> otherwise requested as a "KEEP" by the purchaser. Purchaser must designate the butcher of their choice during the sale.

An auction bid constitutes a contract. When you are the successful bidder of an animal, you have entered into a contract on that animal, and you are contractually bound to pay the bid price. Failure to pay the price is a breech of contract for which you may be liable in court.

TERMS & CONDITIONS:

All livestock will be sold by the "project". See enclosed document.

Turn Animals - The animal will be resold near market price. You will never see this animal after the sale. The guaranteed market value (price per pound) is printed on each sale order with each member's animal. Buyers will only be billed the sale price. Rabbits and poultry are 'turn animals' only.

Keep Animals - An option allowing the buyer to purchase the animal for use in their home freezer. The buyer must pay the <u>full purchase price PLUS packer bid</u>. All "keep" animals (beef, sheep, swine, and goats) will be transported to

Dave's Custom Butchering, Wellston, OH or

Just Meats, Chillicothe, OH for slaughtering, cutting and wrapping of the meat for home-use.

**Keep animals are to be paid in full the night of the sale. Keep buyers MUST indicate intent to keep at the time the auction bid is placed and MUST fill out a Keep Form in the sales office. Buyer must designate choice of butcher at that time. **

Example:

Weight of animal - 220 pounds
Your bid - \$400.00
Multiply the packer bid
by weight of animal:

.50 x 220 = \$110.00

Total invoice =

\$510.00

Split-Group Buying - These are arranged prior to the auction. Each buyer in the group must have their own buyer number. When an animal is sold, each buyer who is included in the buying group with the winning bid on the animal needs to show their number. The invoice for that animal will then be divided evenly to each buyer in the group. (A buyer cannot just hold up their number to be added. You must be a part of the group that is bidding together.)

ATTENDANCE REQUIRED?:

No, it is possible to have bids placed for you. If you would like to buy a particular person's animal, a certain size or type of animal, or spend a designated amount, just let us know. For more information, contact a Sale Committee member prior to the sale.

OTHER WAYS TO SUPPORT:

Sometimes a buyer may wish to help more than just the youngster who owns the animal he has purchased.

Options available to help our Junior Fair exhibitors include:

- Purchasing or bidding on a "Building Fund Animal"
- Adding additional premium to an exhibitor's livestock sale check. Add on premiums must be paid at the time the premium form is submitted, unless other arrangements are made.

This option is only available for youth who go through the livestock sale.
